

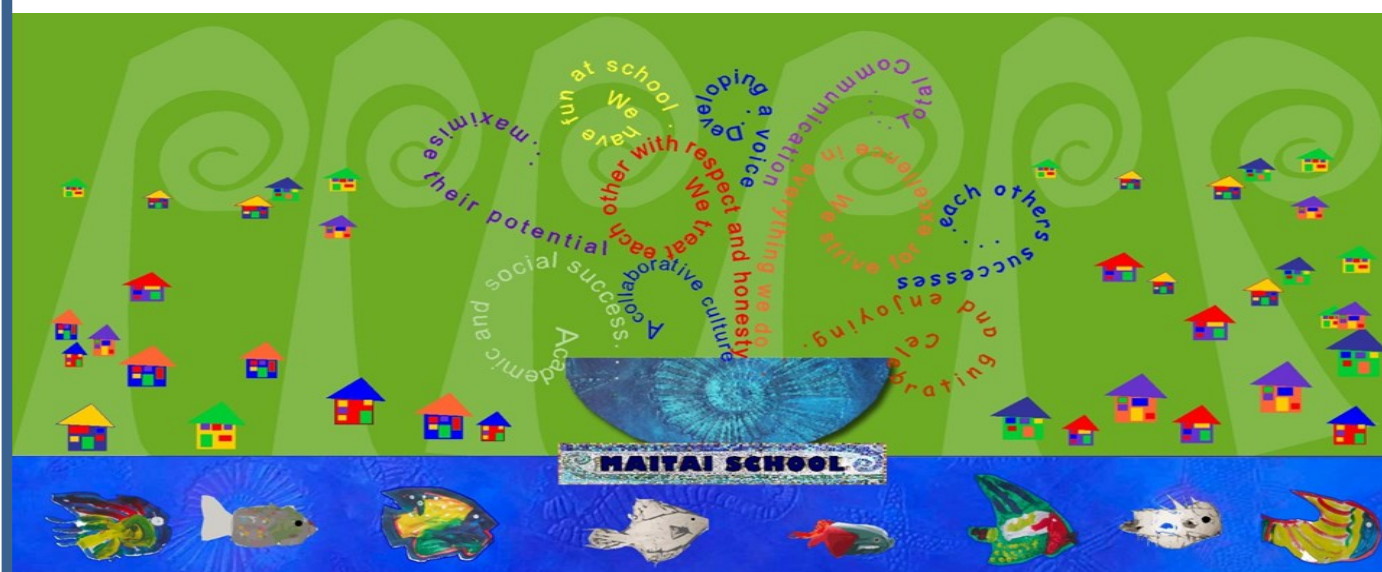

Personnel and employment policy: This policy, along with its various procedures, is now due for review. Funding of schools: Two members of our Board have now met with Hon. Nick Smith and conveyed our concerns about some of the proposed changes to the Education Act, school funding (especially ORS funding), and changes to school organisation. The school trustees association (NZSTA) and the special schools association (SEPANZ) will also be making submissions to the parliamentary select committee, alongside the teachers' and support staff union (NZEI). These groups each have different perspectives, but are agreed the proposed changes do not always put the students first !!

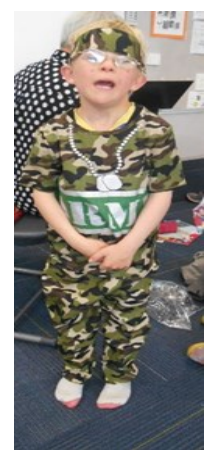

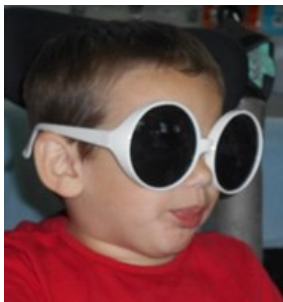

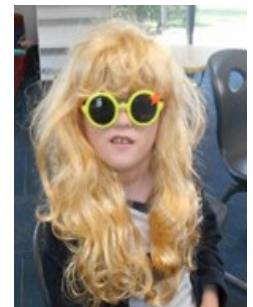
New Students at Maitai@HenleyWaimea?!
